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HEALTH STUDIES CONSISTS OF FOUR COMPULSORY UNITS:

Introduction to Health

This unit looks at how health is defined, the internal and external influences on health, health promotion and health issues.

Personal Health

Through this unit you will explore health issues relevant to young people. You will focus on social, emotional and physical factors that impact on health and investigate the positive and negative outcomes of risk taking behaviour.

Health in Australia

Through the study of Australia's health, you will learn about the environmental factors that impact on the health and wellbeing of all Australians. This will include: developing an understanding of Australia's health care system, knowledge of the health conditions that impact upon the health of Australians, variations in health status of different population groups, health promotion and strategies for preventing ill health.

GLOBAL HEALTH

In this unit you will learn about the key differences and similarities in health status between Less Developed Countries and More Developed Countries. This will involve a study of the major causes of illness and death and the environmental factors in Less Developed Countries that contribute to these.

Topics covered include: natural disasters, poverty, water and sanitation, food and nutrition, status of women, infectious and chronic diseases and foreign aid.
